

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING
SPEED ZONES FOR THE
PRINCETON CHARTER SCHOOL
AND THE PRINCETON FRIENDS
SCHOOL AND AMENDING THE
"CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY, 1968".**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Princeton
as follows:

1. Section 11-2(a) of the "Code of the Township of Princeton, New Jersey, 1968"
which establishes thirty-five (35) mile per hour speed limits along
various streets or parts of streets within the Township is amended by
changing the reference to Bunn Drive to read as follows:

"Bunn Drive, both directions, entire
length between Poor Farm Road and
Harrison Street North[.], except when
passing through the Princeton Charter
School area as signed, motorists shall drive
at twenty-five (25) miles per hour in said
school zone during recess, when children
can clearly be seen or while children are
going to or leaving school during opening
or closing hours."

2. Section 11-2(b) of said Code which establishes a forty (40) mile per hour speed
limit along streets or parts of streets within the Township is amended by
changing the reference therein for Quaker Road to read as follows:

"Quaker Road, both directions, between the Princeton Pike and the Princeton Township/Lawrence Township line[.], except when passing through the Princeton Friends School area as signed, vehicles shall proceed at twenty-five (25) miles per hour within said school zone, during recess, when children can clearly be seen or while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing hours."

3. Section 11-2(c) of said Code which establishes a forty-five (45) mile per hour speed limit along streets or parts of streets within the Township is amended by changing the reference therein to Princeton Pike - Mercer Street to read as follows:

"Princeton Pike - Mercer Street, (all Route 583, both directions)[.] except when passing through the Princeton Friends School zone as signed, vehicles shall proceed at twenty-five (25) miles per hour during recess, when children can clearly be seen or while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing hours."

4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication and upon the erection of regulatory signs to effect the above-referenced school zones, all of which is required by law.
