To the Princeton Community:

The Princeton Regional Health Department and Health Commission are pleased to provide Borough and Township residents with an updated version of the Health Resources Directory, which was first issued in booklet form in 1998. This latest printed version adds organizational web sites where they exist, and the information contained in this booklet can also be found online at www.princetonboro.org. The primary aims of this directory are to help Princetonians find programs and services that meet their needs, and to facilitate local agencies and organizations in their coordination, collaboration, planning, and referral of health programs and services.

Although errors in a compendium of this sort are inevitable, we have made every effort to provide accurate and up-to-date information. Residents who note problems of any sort, including not being able to find what they are looking for, should let us know. As second section, Part II — Programs, will detail specific programs available at local agencies and organizations, and will be issued sometime in the future.
